of Dr. Carl Heilman

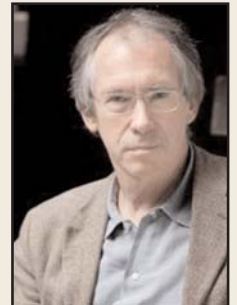
with Dr. Neil Kitchen and his wife

We had a private tour with lunch at the British Museum, followed by dinner at the world's oldest hospital, St. Bart's. As Neil reminded us, this was where he trained and met his wonderful wife Amanda, who still works there as a senior nurse.

The next day we met at Guy's Hospital and after presentations, we were treated to a tour of the Old Operating Theatre in St. Thomas Church. This is the only surviving 19<sup>th</sup> century operating theater and has the quotation "*Miseratione non Mercede.*" Reminding us about ethics, it means *from compassion not for gain* - yet another reiteration about the importance of ethics in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. After a walking tour around London, we visited the Tate Museum.

One of the highlights of the visit was a exclusive tour of the House of Parliament. Arranged by Neil, this was a major coup, especially on the day the British government changed hands from Tony Blair to George Brown. The group also had a private tour of Westminster Abbey and walked around the graves of John Hunter, William Shakespeare, Geoffrey Chaucer, and William Pitt.

All in all, it was a well attended meeting with more than 75 participants. Thank you again to Neil and Amanda for their warm hospitality, kindness, and attention to detail which made it a very memorable meeting.

## Author Michael Chabon 2008 University Lecturer

Pulitzer Prize winning author Michael Chabon is an American author born in 1963. He is "one of the most celebrated writers of his generation," according to the *The Virginia Quarterly Review*.

His first novel, "*The Mysteries of Pittsburgh*" (1988), was published when he was 25-years-old and catapulted him to the status of literary celebrity.

Chabon followed it with a second novel, "*Wonder Boys*" (1995), and two short-story collections. In 2000, Chabon published "*The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier & Clay*," a critically acclaimed novel that *The New York Review of Books* called his *magnum opus*. It won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction in 2001. His latest novel, "*The Yiddish Policemen's Union*," was published in 2007 to enthusiastic reviews.

Dr. Thomas J. Fogarty is an internationally recognized cardiovascular surgeon and inventor.

During the past 40 years, he has acquired over 100 medical patents, including the "industry standard" Fogarty Balloon Embolectomy Catheter and the widely used Aneurx Stent Graft that replaces traditional open abdominal aortic aneurysm surgery.

Dr. Fogarty is the recipient of countless awards and honors; most significantly, the Jacobson Innovation Award of the American College of Surgeons, the 2000 Lemelson-MIT prize for Invention and Innovation and was inducted into the Inventors Hall of Fame in December 2001.

He will give a lecture on the problems between academics and corporate industry.

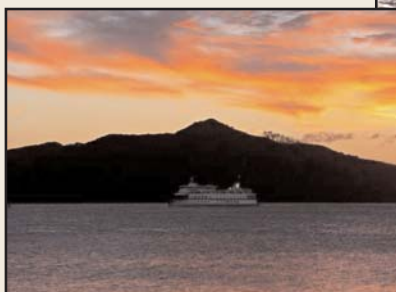

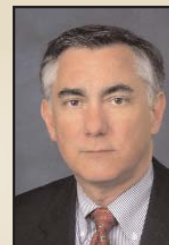
